



## HOW TO SIGN UP FOR SCRIP

- ❖ Go [www.shopwithscrip.com](http://www.shopwithscrip.com) → Click “Register” in the top right corner → Click on “Join a Scrip Program” → Copy and paste this code into the Enrollment Code box: A857EFL85563 → Double check that the next screen shows “St. John PTP/MD” in the top right corner of the screen.
  - **IMPORTANT**
    - Enter your child’s name as the student (you can leave the classroom/group field blank)
    - Make a note of which of your phone number you use on the account
- ❖ Complete a Scrip agreement. One must be completed for EVERY account created on the SWS website (if you have family members or friends who wish to create accounts, they must also complete an agreement). To access and complete an agreement, please visit our TCP website ( <https://tinyurl.com/y9r65sos> ).
- ❖ Go back to [www.shopwithscrip.com](http://www.shopwithscrip.com) → Log in to your account → click “Family Functions” on the left side of the screen → click “Presto Pay” → click “Family Registration” and go through the steps to set up a new account
  - They will deposit two small amounts into your checking account with about two business days. Be on the lookout for them and make a note of the amounts when you see them. As soon as they show up go back to Presto Pay and complete the registration process.
  - Once you have entered the necessary information you will be given a four digit code. Write that code down and email it to Stephanie Anderson orCarolynn West ([stjohns.tcp@gmail.com](mailto:stjohns.tcp@gmail.com))
- ❖ There is also an app called My Scrip Wallet that you can use while out and about if you are interested. This is not a required step by any means. More information about the app is available here: <https://www.shopwithscrip.com/Support/faq/msw>
- ❖ If you are ordering a physical card you will need to pick it up for you at the Scrip table at the school. A lot of cards can then be reloaded online using your account and Presto Pay after that first purchase. You will need to check the icon on the retailer you are purchasing from to see which ones allow reload and virtual cards (this is obvious once you are in the system).
